- Fire Science isn't just about putting out fires. Students in the Fire Science program will also learn about building construction, fire safety and prevention, working with hazardous materials, and administering fire services.

Fire Science @ QCC

The Fire Science program at QCC prepares students for a range of career opportunities in fields related to fire response, prevention, and investigation. Graduates are prepared to begin or continue their careers in firefighting, fire investigation, and related fields.

The program offers extensive coursework, including courses on the basic Principles of Emergency Service, Emergency Medical Technology, Fire Behavior and Combustion, Fire Prevention, Fire and Emergency Services Administration, and fire-safe Building Construction.

 The Fire Science Associate Degree program is designed to be equally accessible and useful to students with no background in fire service and to those already in the fire- or emergency-related fields who wish to advance their careers.
