- Virtually all companies and organizations, whether public or private, employ information technology professionals.
- The growth of Internet crime such as identity theft, spamming, e-mail harassment, and illegal downloading will increase the demand for computer forensic experts.
- As the number of devices that connect to the Internet grows so will the need for cyber security specialists.
- A certificate can be a first step towards earning an Associate's degree. Students
 who complete an Associate's degree at QCC may be able to transfer to a variety of
 other schools to further continue their education.

Computer Forensics @ QCC

The Computer Forensics Option Certificate is one of seven offered by the Computer Systems Engineering Technology (CSET) program. The CSET program at QCC prepares students for a broad range of career opportunities in the Information Technology (IT) field. Graduates are prepared to work in virtually any business or organization that utilizes computers and computer networks. This is accomplished by adhering to industry standards developed to measure and promote the competency of IT professionals. Graduates of the Computer Forensics Certificate program will have strong IT skills in addition to knowledge about investigating, reporting, and combating electronic crime.

The Computer Forensics Certificate at QCC develops a students' ability to investigate cybercrime and recover lost data that can be used as evidence in court. This program includes both computer and criminal justice courses so that students will have insight into both fields. The Computer Forensics Certificate may be completed in two semesters.
