If you answered "yes" to these questions, you may want to consider a career in Emergency Medical Services (EMS).

Did You Know...?

- Knowledge of Emergency Medical Services can help your career both within and outside the medical field.
- QCC offers several different options to fit your interest in Emergency Medical Services. There are Basic and Intermediate EMT certificates, an EMT Paramedic certificate, and a Paramedic Technology A.S. degree.
- The Bureau of Labor Statistics has reported that the employment outlook for EMTs is extremely positive, with new jobs appearing "much faster than average."

Emergency Medical Services @ QCC

The Emergency Medical Services program at QCC prepares students for a variety of careers in emergency medical settings. Students may choose to take a Basic EMT course or continue on through Intermediate EMT, Paramedic, and Paramedic Technology curriculums.

QCC's Emergency Medical Services options range in length from one semester for an EMT-Basic Certificate to five semesters for a Paramedic Technology A.S. Students will learn about human anatomy and physiology, as well as how to respond to a variety of situations that EMTs and Paramedics may face. Students in the EMT-Basic course will spend time observing in the field, while students in the Intermediate and Paramedic courses will perform hands-on work both in clinical hospital settings and while in a field internship with local advanced providers.

All students who wish to take the EMT-Intermediate course must have a current EMT-Basic certification and one year of experience working as an EMT. Students wishing to enter the Paramedic Technology Associate Degree Program must have a current EMT-Basic or EMT-Intermediate Certification and one year of experience as an EMT-Basic.
