Did You Know...?

- Surgical technologists work in a variety of medical settings, including operating rooms, clinics, and surgery centers.
- "Surgical Technologist" is ranked as one of the fastest growing jobs in Massachusetts through 2014. Worcester has a higher-than-average number of hospitals, so growth opportunities may be larger in the QCC area.
- Students who have finished the Surgical Technology Certificate can immediately
 enter the workforce or, choose to continue their studies to get an Associate's
 Degree in a health profession such as Registered Nursing.

Surgical Technology @ QCC

The Surgical Technology Certificate program at QCC prepares students to begin a career as a Surgical Technologist, Operating Room Technician or to make progress towards an Associate's degree in an allied health profession. The Surgical Technology program can be completed in three semesters; the coursework amounts to forty-one credits.

The program offers extensive coursework. Some of the required courses are Principles of Human Biology, Operating Room Techniques, Asepsis, Advanced Surgical Procedures, and Ethics. In addition, students in the Surgical Technology program will complete clinical externships in their second and third semesters.

At the conclusion of the three-semester curriculum, program graduates receive a Surgical Technology Certificate. QCC's Surgical Technology Program has received accreditation from the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs.

Students wishing to enter the Surgical Technology course must pass the TEAS exam with a 45% composite score. Students must also submit to a CORI/SORI check and provide certain medical documentation.
