<p>Credit through Competency Exams</p>	<p><b>CLEP:</b> The College Level Examination Program (CLEP), a nationally recognized competency testing opportunity, was developed to enable individuals to earn college credit by examination. Credit is awarded to students who achieve acceptable scores on the general CLEP battery and/or specific CLEP subject matter examinations. The general battery includes examinations in English, humanities, mathematics, and natural sciences/history.
