# What is High-Demand?

High Demand means that we have more qualified students than we have seats available in a particular program within an academic year. Students complete Admissions requirements to qualify for their program.

Once qualified, they are placed in the next available seat. This can mean that they are placed on a waitlist.





## Criteria-based Admissions Process

#### **Criteria-based Admissions means:**

- Once you meet your program's Admissions <u>requirements</u>, then you will be offered a seat in your chosen program.
- When a program fills for one academic year, qualified students will be placed on a <u>waitlist</u> in the next available semester.





#### General Requirements for Most Programs

- Must have a high school diploma or GED.
- If your program requires a **science course**, it must be taken within 5 years of application to the program.

  Required grade must be earned within two attempts of taking and completing the course.
- Required TEAS scores must be achieved within 3 attempts of taking the test (unless otherwise stated).
- Required TEAS scores must be earned within 5 years of application to the program.
- "Composite" score must be earned in 1 test (cannot be a combination of multiple tests).
- (Most) Must attend/complete a **Health Careers Information Session**

### **TEAS**

#### (Test of Essential Academic Skills)

- Four-part, web-based, supervised assessment
- Subtests:
  - Reading comprehension, Mathematics, Science, English language
- Required to qualify for most healthcare programs

## **Application Outcomes**

Once your application is evaluated, you will receive a letter indicating that you are:

- Qualified and <u>accepted</u> to the program
- Qualified and placed on a waitlist, or;
- Non-qualified:
  - Accepted to the appropriate Healthcare program
    - Healthcare
    - Healthcare Pre-Nursing Option
    - Healthcare Pre-Dental Hygiene Option

If you are not qualified, contact the Advising Center for guidance on how to qualify for your program.

Nurse Education	~ 2 years
Practical Nursing Certificate	~ 1 year
Practical Nursing Certificate-Evening	~ 1 year
Radiologic Technology	~ 4 years





## It is best to think of this as a 3 step process:

- 1. Qualify/meet program Admissions requirements (and be placed in program or on waitlist). You will receive a letter from the Admissions Office of your start term (Fall, Spring or Summer term).
- 2. Take general education classes that are part of your program while on waitlist.
- 3. Move from waitlist status to accepted status and attend professional classes/clinical portion of program training.





## **COVID-19 Vaccination Policy**

QCC Healthcare programs and their clinical sites are requiring that participating students must be vaccinated.





#### **Immunizations**

- Immunizations are required before beginning your professional classes
- Immunizations List is available here: Immunizations Information
- It is important that you complete all necessary immunizations as soon as possible because some immunizations, such as Hepatitis B vaccination series, requires a minimum of 6-8 months to complete from start to finish.
- If an accepted student has not completed all immunizations at the time he/she is scheduled to begin, they will be withdrawn from the program. Students will need to reapply to the health program for acceptance to the next available space.





## Immunizations (cont.)

- Each health program has a specific deadline date for Immunization records to be submitted. Students will be notified of this date prior to the start of the program. Health program health information is in addition to what the student has previously submitted to the Registrar's Office.
- Students are required to demonstrate current CPR certification (healthcare provider level, online CPR certification is not accepted) and health insurance coverage.
- No student will be allowed to begin the clinical component of any health program until
  proof has been received that all immunization requirements have been completed.











## Academic Advising

What is an Academic Advisor?

- Point of contact for academic issues
- Outline your educational and career goals
- Develop your Academic Plan to achieve success
- Map out your program courses and requirements
- Prepare for self-registration/register for courses
- When in doubt, ask an Advisor!

CORI/SORI/National Background Check/Drug testing is required prior to any clinical placement. A positive in any of these areas may prevent you from participating in a clinical/field rotation.



#### **Glossary of Admissions Healthcare Terms**

- Program Requirements: Academic and testing standards (see Health Career Admission criteria) student must meet to be eligible for professional program.
- Qualify: Complete all Program Requirements.
- **High Demand**: More qualified students in one academic year than there are seats in desired program.
- TEAS: Test of Essential Academic Skills (Program Requirement)
- Waitlist: Qualified students given next available seat in their desired program. (Future academic year)
- **General Education Courses:** Required for degree or certificate but not restricted to major. (Ex: ENG, BIO, PSY, HST, SOC, MAT.) All programs differ.
- Professional Program: Clinical and professional courses (ex: NUR, PNP, DHY)
- Immunizations: Required to begin professional courses (NUR, PNP, DHY, RDT, etc.)
